Augustus Tolton was finally ordained in Rome, and returned to the United States to serve the people of God, most especially African-Americans.

I need to raise \$75,000 for pay this production. Can you send something right away, so that I can get


started? \$100 would be terrific - but if you send more, we could sure use it. And, of course, if you can send less, I will be very, very grateful for whatever

A few mornings ago, I got call from my daughter, Mary, at 6:30 in the morning. She's 25, and lives and works in Denver, Colorado. Mary told me that when she came out to her car to go to work, she noticed that the trunk was open, and then when she drove away, she realized everything was in

disarray in the car. She had apparently left the door unlocked, and someone had broken in. Her headphones were gone, but nothing else.

This was disturbing to her, but what was really weird was that night I had had a very vivid dream. I dreamt that someone had broken into our house and smashed every window on the bottom floor. That was all there was to it – no additional details, just all these broken windows. A coincidence

Now, my Mary is the one who told me about an amazing phenomenon called fetal microchimerism. This is a scientifically documented fact that DNA from the cells

of a child are found in the brain — and other organs — of his or her mother. "Microchimerism most commonly arises during pregnancy

when cells from a fetus pass through the placenta and into the mother's body—and vice versa."

So the child remains part of the mother forever. This has profound medical and theological implications, and I think that

Stephen Cox was fourteen years old when he saw the movie

Thérèse. It changed his life, sparking a religious vocation that finally brought him to Mount Angel Benedictine Abbey where After seeing Thérèse, Stephen started researching monastic life. God was calling him, but the problem was he had epilepsy. He applied to several religious orders that had some connection with Saint Thérèse, but they all turned him down because of his illness. Finally, God brought him to Mount Angel.

When Stephen found out that part of our movie Thérèse was filmed at Mount Angel, he was overjoyed and took it as confirmation that this was the place God wanted him.

fourteen-year-old who realized that more than anything else she wanted to give her life to God. Young Thérèse Martin went all the

way to the Pope to ask his permission, and she finally entered the Carmelite Monastery in Lisieux, France a year later. When she was just 24 years old, she died of tuberculosis. Before her death she told her sisters, "I want to spend my heaven doing good on earth."

She did that. And you helped her, when you prayed and sacrificed for *Thérèse*, the movie. A young boy in Concord, California, met her and gave his life to God.

They asked him, "Why do you want to be a monk of Mount Angel Abbey?" His reply echoed Saint Thérèse, "Because I want to be a saint and I think that this is the best place for me to do that." That simple

answer, his innocence, and his childlike joy touched the Abbot, and he welcomed him.

Brother Stephen had completed all the requirements as a postulant and had been accepted by the community to enter the novitiate, but he died three days prior to the ceremony. The week

before, he had joked to one of his brothers, "When we're novices, they have to bury us in the Abbey cemetery."

That's what they did. Brother Stephen was buried in the Abbey cemetery in the habit of a Benedictine novice on September 10. 2014. He is now with his community forever. Let's pray for this beautiful soul, and let's try to be like him, with a joyful smile, and Saint Thérèse's childlike trust in God's Mercy.

We are humbled here at Saint Luke to have been part of Brother Stephen's life here on earth. May he rest in peace.


